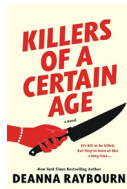
STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS: Books We Think Should Be Adapted into Movies

Newport Art Bazaar is the perfect place to NAB holiday gifts at stellar prices. There will be plenty of items to peruse—from ceramics

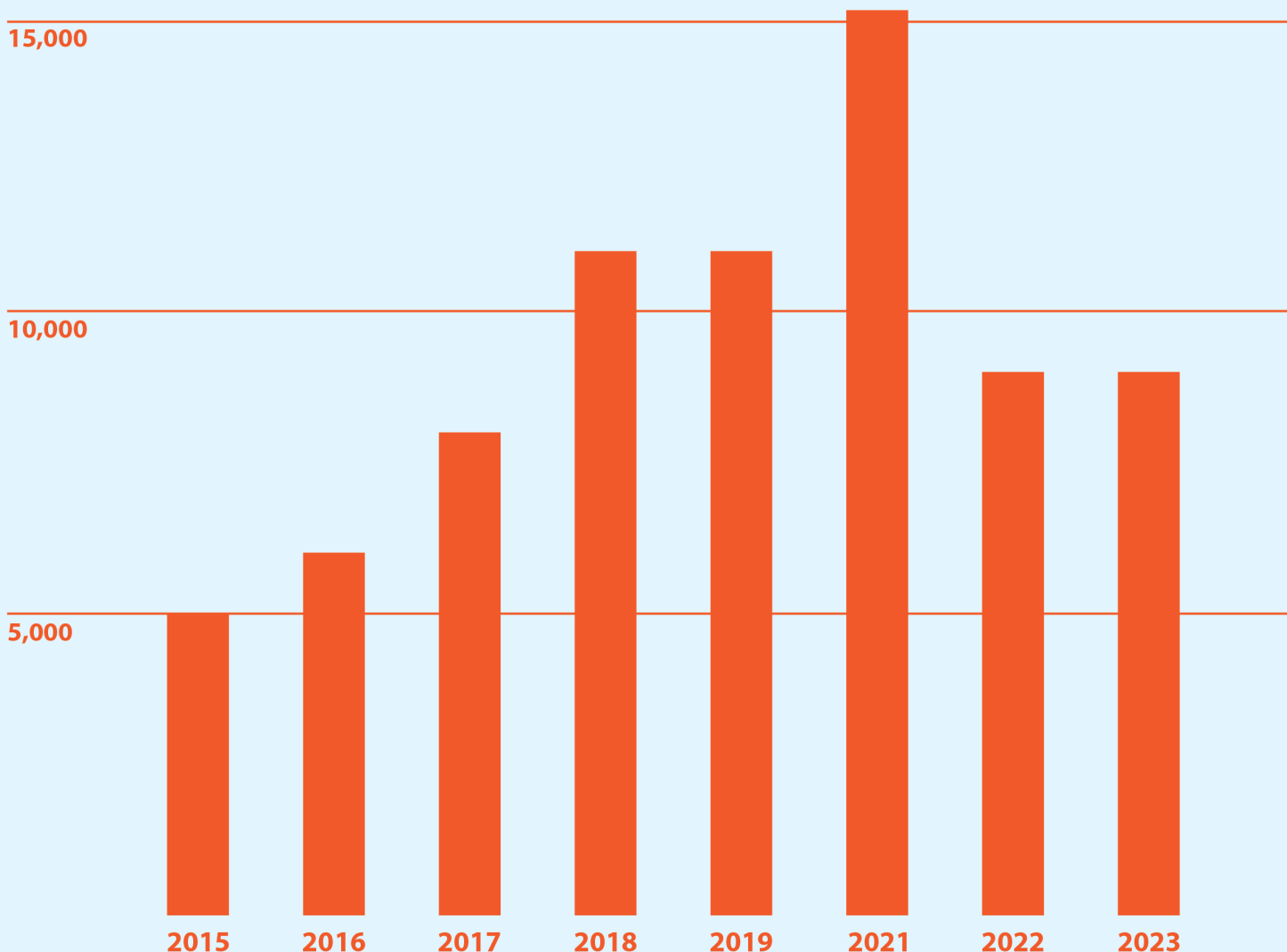
to metal work to textiles and everything in between. The bazaar will be held on two levels of the Newport Branch on Saturday, Nov. 9 from 11 am-4 pm.

Cam Cares has entered the chat. Previously Drop Your Drawers, Cam Cares will operate under the same premise: collecting socks, underwear, bras and t-shirts for Family Resource Centers in local public schools this November and December.

Like in previous years, the library aims to raise 7,000 pairs of new undergarments in their original packaging. The donations help meet a crucial, but often overlooked, need. All four branches will accept donations, which can be any size! Items will be distributed to public elementary, middle and high schools in Campbell County.

How and why does the campaign help? Read below for quick points!

- **The library aims to raise 7,000 items.**
- **Family Resource Centers hand out 100 or more of such items every month to children in need.**
- **Children and teens may need undergarments for reasons ranging from accidents at school to illness to inability to wash clothes regularly and other circumstances at home.**
- **Raising such items annually allow schools to redirect funding to provide other valuable resources.**

- **Parents are often unable to bring fresh undergarments from home during school hours; Cam Cares helps keep students from missing valuable classroom time!**

The campaign first launched in 2015 at CCPL. Our community has donated nearly 75,000 items throughout the campaign's run. In the years since, it was adopted by library systems across the country. Cam Cares launches Nov. 1 and will run through Dec. 31.

A Look at How One Group Uses Our Meeting Rooms!

The Civil War Roundtable of Northern Kentucky has met in the Cold Spring Branch's meeting rooms since 2005—nearly two decades. Ken Hoffman has been there from the start. His passion for Civil War history is clear; but so, too, is his love for the library.

Hoffman started the club with the late Larry Hannigan after the two became connected by a former reference desk employee.

"She mentioned to me, 'There's another older gentleman I know from Fort Thomas; he's a Civil War enthusiast and would probably like to talk to you,'" recalls Hoffman; they initially talked over the phone and went on to form the organization.

How does the club work? Every month—usually the second Tuesday at 7 pm—Hoffman says they either have a speaker or discussion about various Civil War-related people, places or other topics. One recent example is Battle of Richmond Curator Phillip Seyfrit, who discussed Confederate general Edmund Kirby Smith. The group averages 12-15 attendees, though some speakers draw more.

"The library is a central facility," says Hoffman. "Most people that have any education or culture about them will use the library, even if they don't use it themselves, they bring their kids here for books or programs," says Hoffman. "They look upon


[the roundtable] and are, like, 'Wow, I didn't know that group was there.' They all of a sudden come and start enjoying our speakers and the group. It has helped us develop."

Every branch has meeting rooms that outside groups are welcome to reserve while not in use for regularly scheduled library programs. All meetings must be open to the public. View availability and make a request at cc-pl.org/services/meeting-study-rooms.

"It's a great place to be; it's easy to get here; we always have great speakers," says Marty Neltner, a roundtable regular. "We're learning about things that we didn't learn about before."
