

Here, you'll learn all about email basics, including how to create strong passwords, using drafts, adding attachments and more. If you're already comfortable with using email, make sure to check out future topics. At Talking Tech Troubles, older adults can learn about various tech topics without worry of judgment.

• Tuesday, Feb. 18 at 2 pm: Journalist Lee Hawkins will discuss his memoir, I Am Nobody's Slave: How Uncovering My Family's History Set Me Free, which tells the story of one Black family's pursuit of the American Dream. This book examines how trauma from enslavement and Jim Crow shaped their outlook on thriving in America, influenced each generation, and how they succeeded despite these challenges.
